It exceeded our expectations, and we can't wait for Cupcake Run 2017!

This family fun event allowed for several local high school groups to volunteer in our community, while younger kids played games and watched a movie in the barn. The spring grant cycle proved to be another hard competition for our grant selection committee. The blind selection process allows an unbiased selection, and I know first hand how difficult it is to choose which projects get funded and which won't make the cut. This grant cycle awarded five grants for a total of \$9,237.


Our inaugural Cupcake Run for Public Education brought together over 900 supporters.
